***Public worship at St Thomas' Millbrook has resumed!***  
***Service this Sunday, November 29<sup>th</sup>***  
***First Sunday of Advent***  
***The Holy Eucharist at 10.30 am***

**There will be two Christmas eve services this year: Sung Eucharists at 4 pm and 7 pm. There will be no Christmas Day service.** Owing to Covid-19 gathering restrictions, the number of people in the church must be strictly limited; thus, admission to the Christmas eve services is by **advance reservation only**. In order to maintain physical distancing, we are only able to use every second pew, and to have either two individuals per pew or one family group or 'social bubble' (up to 4 adults) per pew. **Seating reservations will open this Sunday and close on Friday, December 18<sup>th</sup> at noon.** Please make your reservations after Sunday services or call the parish office during regular office hours (705-932-2233).
